

# **Great Finborough Parish Meeting**

## **Minutes of the Great Finborough Annual Parish Meeting held on 14<sup>th</sup> May 2024** **Held in Pettiward Hall**

1. The minutes of previous meeting of 10<sup>th</sup> May 2023 were approved and signed.
2. Cllr Otton gave her report, which is attached to these minutes.
3. Cllr Matthissen gave his report, which is attached. Cllr Matthissen added that he is pleased to support the flood alleviation group and noted that the planning application for Green Farm would probably be some months before it reached a planning committee for decision. In the meantime planning committee councillors would visit the site to establish more clarity of the permissions already granted and the uses of each building on the site. Cllr Matthissen confirmed that land owned by MSDC adjacent to Wash Lane had invasive Himalayan Balsam present and efforts to eradicate this were under way. A work Party is planned for June 11<sup>th</sup> and all are welcome to join in. Cllr Matthissen confirmed that he had contributed to the rebuilding of Pettiward Hall chimney from his locality budget and that his new fund is now open for applications.

There are 300 plus names of people from local villages and everyone is welcome to come along.
