Your Local NHS Community First Responders

On behalf of your Ambulance Community First Responders (CFRs), I'd like to say a heartfelt thank you to everyone who organised and attended the recent Village Quiz Night at Pettiward Hall. Your incredible generosity raised over £600 for the local responder group.

Every penny goes directly towards keeping us operational, funding vital equipment and ongoing training so we can continue to respond to 999 emergencies right here in your community. It was wonderful for my partner, Melissa, and me, to finally meet so many of you in person on the night. We've been made to feel so welcome since moving to the village a year ago, thank you all. Also, a big thank you to Roly and Mandy at The Chestnut Horse for their separate donation following their pub quiz night! Once again, this funding goes straight back into the community we proudly serve.

With winter approaching, the NHS Ambulance Service is already feeling the strain. This makes local CFR groups more important than ever to ensure that medical help arrives as quickly as possible. In October alone, your local team attended over 20 emergency calls in and around Great Finborough including sepsis, breathing difficulties, and even cardiac arrests, where we were first on scene to each, providing immediate life-saving support before the blue-light ambulance arrived. So these donations really do save lives!

Three of our members have also recently completed 'Restart a Heart' instructor training, meaning we can now teach members of the public vital skills such as CPR and the use of a community Automated External Defibrillator (AED), which, thanks to the Parish Council, we are fortunate to have right here in the village. If any local group would like free training in CPR, AED use, or basic first aid, please get in touch. We recently ran a child-friendly session for the Boys' Brigade in Combs Ford and will soon be offering training to the Stowmarket Police Cadets and Great Finborough Primary School pupils in early 2026. To arrange a session, contact Richard.Lock@eastamb.nhs.uk, we'd love to help your group gain the skills that can truly save a life.

Earlier in November, the Parish Council Finance Committee met to plan the budget for April 2026 to March 2027. The meeting focused on reviewing the council's expected income and expenditure for the year ahead. Once this is calculated, the council can set the precept—the amount that appears on your council tax bill and is paid directly to the Parish Council.

The precept is one of the council's main sources of income and helps to fund a wide range of local services, including grass cutting, play park insurance, general maintenance, and the regular emptying of dog waste bins. Each area of spending is carefully reviewed to account for any likely cost increases from suppliers.

In addition to the precept, the council receives funding from new housing developments through the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL). This money is considered strategically to determine how it can best be used—both to support existing commitments and to fund new projects, such as the recently installed Speed Indicator Devices (SIDs).

The council also maintains a reserve fund to cover unexpected costs. Even with careful planning, unforeseen issues can arise. For example, a few years ago, trees on parish land had to be professionally felled, an expensive but necessary safety measure.

This summary offers just a glimpse into the financial planning that supports our village. We hope it helps explain how funds are managed and, if needed, why changes to the precept may occur.

In November, with help from other residents we repainted the lines in the car park; this saved the village £900. We still have a bit to do but well done all. Also, we tackled the overhrown hedges near the football pitch which had completly consumed the original footpath.

Sadly, I have to report of issues with dog mess on some of our paths. Please use the bins around the village to dispose of correctly and don't leave near or around the bins.

It was great to see the 'Tommy' figures on the village green, a small gesture but hugely impactful.



Obituary

Dugal Nisbet-Smith, aged 90 years, died peacefully at home on 13 November 2025, having left his native New Zealand long ago. He lived in the village with his wife, Ann, for many years. His working life was in journalism and newspapers, and it took him all over the world. He held very senior positions in the news organisations that dominated Britain in the second half of the 20th century. He knew, was respected by, and influenced many senior politicians and other leaders. In 1980 he was managing director of Times Newspapers Ltd. Awarded a CBE for services to the newspaper industry, when retiring as director of the Newspaper Society after 14 years in 1997, Dugal was presented with the Society's President's Prize, seldom awarded.

In a long and fruitful! retirement, Dugal became a sculptor and produced many works of art. He read and increased his knowledge voraciously, retaining his interest in current affairs and world events to the very end. His discourse was always filled with humour and immense detail, achieved with the unstinting support of Ann - herself having had a notable medical career. Dugal enjoyed his home, garden, good food and friends. He appreciated the loyal support of Michaela over nearly 2 decades. Most of all he loved and spoke proudly of his 3 children and many grandchildren. He is and will be sadly missed.

Archeological Treasures

Footpath users on the 'three bridges' route will have noticed the excavations in the field below the reservoir. The trees and topsoil have been removed in preparation for the construction of a second reservoir to feed the golf course. An extended archaeological survey took place between 13 October and 7 November.

The archaeological team has uncovered some probably medieval drains and ditches which will be recorded and mapped. A brick-making clamp believed to date from the 16 th century was uncovered, which may signify the site was used for firing bricks, possibly to aid the construction of Finborough Hall.

The discovery adds a fascinating layer to our heritage.

With it coming up to Christmas, I want to do more shopping online, but there's been things in the news about delivery problems. I'm worried about not receiving things on time or packages being lost. What should I do if my parcel goes missing?

When you're online shopping, it's not always clear whom to contact if things go wrong.

As a customer your contract is with the seller that you bought the item from. It's the seller's responsibility to make sure the item is delivered to you. They should chase the courier to find out what happened to your order if there's a problem.

If your parcel hasn't arrived:

- Check the delivery address you gave the seller, to make sure it's correct.
- Then contact the seller and ask where your order is.
- If the seller claims they've delivered it or doesn't know where it is, you can ask for a redelivery. You might be able to get a refund in some circumstances where the delivery time was essential, and you let the seller know ahead of time.

Under the Consumer Rights Act 2015, you can ask the seller to deliver the item to you again if the item wasn't delivered either by an agreed date, or within a reasonable time - usually within 30 days. If the new delivery fails to come within a reasonable time, you can ask the seller for a refund.

Another problem people face is when parcels get left in different places, for example outside or with a neighbour.

Cont.

If your item was delivered by Royal Mail:

- And they left your package with a neighbour or in a certain place be cause you told them to, it's not the seller or Royal Mail's responsibility if it gets lost.
- If they leave it somewhere you hadn't instructed, it's the seller's responsibility if it gets lost. You should contact the seller to ask for a redelivery or a refund.

If the item was delivered by a courier:

 Check your terms and conditions or account details - they might include other places for delivery, like your porch or a neighbour's house. If you agreed to them, it's not the seller's or courier's responsibility if your order has gone missing. However, if you did not agree to this, then it's the seller's responsibility if your order goes missing.

Village Biodiversity Plan

A village biodiversity plan is a local strategy to conserve and enhance biodiversity, often created by the parish council and community. These plans typically involve surveying local wildlife, identifying threats, and outlining actions for residents and other organisations to take e.g. the Parish Council. This can include managing green spaces sustainably, considering biodiversity in planning applications, and running local conservation projects. This is part of a wider framework that includes national and regional strategies aiming to reverse biodiversity loss.

To help create our plan in Great Finborough, we would welcome input from any residents currently doing similar activity, no matter how small, such as erecting bat and bird boxes, documenting birds in your gardens or even planting hedgerows and native trees, as well



as the ongoing development of our wildflower meadow and Woodpecker Hill wood

Understanding what goes on in our village will help us shape the plan which can then be utilised when looking at bigger green space projects, as well as suggestions for future planning applications. This has already been adopted at Pettiward Hall where we erected swift boxes to encourage nesting.

As well as the positive, we can review any negative elements that are identified, such as invasive weeds or trees growing where they shouldn't and any potential threats to local wildlife.
