Welcome to the June Newsletter:

Following on from requests for ideas to improve the village, I am pleased to say people are coming forward with great ideas but please keep them coming in. It could be anything from outdoor exercise equipment to improvements to paths or signs in the village. We can't guarantee every idea will come to fruition, but all will be seriously considered.

As a village, like many, we are considering the idea of a neighbourhood plan. A neighbourhood plan is a community-led framework that guides the future development, regeneration, and conservation of Great Finborough. It allows residents, businesses, and landowners to work together to shape the growth and character of their local area, setting a vision for what the community wants to see happen. These plans are legally binding if they meet certain conditions, including passing a local referendum. Having this plan helps shape our village moving forward in particular housing projects; how they look, where they should go, what should be around them etc.

This isn't just a Parish Council project, it needs inclusion of members of the village as it affects all of us. If you would like to get involved with early discussions, with a view to be involved with a committee to take it forward, please get in touch.

Sadly, we have had a reported incident of theft in the village. The honesty tin for produce off the allotments was broken into and the money stolen. Should you witness anything like this, please report it to the local police.

As mentioned in previous editions, if anyone would like to help with the Community Speedwatch, please get in touch. Being visible in the village is definitely a deterrent to speeding drivers.

Our next village maintenance day is scheduled for Saturday 19th July. Meeting in the village car park off Middlefield Drive at 10am. We will undertake litter picking as well as any other maintenance jobs needed. If you can spare an hour or 2 then please get involved. I'll post any updates on the village notice board such as any useful tools needed!

If you are enjoying the good weather and taking in the many paths surrounding Finborough, please let us know if you come across missing signs, broken bridges, gates or paths not being cut or sprayed off.

Composting and Simpler Recycling

This is to introduce my services as an official Master Composter, a voluntary role with Suffolk County Council and Garden Organic. We support householders, schools and businesses to try composting and/or improve their composting methods and success in producing good quality



compost for gardens and house plants whilst saving money and helping the planet. I can come to your garden and advise on equipment and methods to meet your needs, or troubleshoot if you think your composting arrangements aren't working well enough. Also happy to talk to groups locally about this, and can help you find this service from another Master Composter if further afield but still in Suffolk. Message me on the number below.

What materials we compost and how we recycle the same and different materials are inter-related. Big changes are coming next year to recycling, with the whole nation benefitting from more waste being picked up from our homes and businesses. From April 2025 businesses with 10 or more employees had to separate out their food waste for it to be collected, and from 2026 (date to be decided) all households will be given a 2 part raw/cooked food waste bin, and food waste will be collected weekly. Glass and cartons will be collected in a new blue bin. into which the metals and plastics we currently put in green bins will also go. The green bins will only be used for cardboard and paper. There will be very little left to go in black bins so the blue, green and black bins will be collected 3 weekly in rotation.

From 2027 plastic film/soft plastics will also be picked up from our homes. Brown bins will continue to be available to households that subscribe for a modest annual charge.



PLASTIC IS NOT FANTASTIC!

Talking to some of our younger supporters recently, their big concern is plastic pollution. Traces of plastic are everywhere, in soil, up mountains, in our seas, in our bodies. It lasts a very long time - your coffee pod, plastic bottle, man-made textiles, plastic toothbrush may well be around 500 years from now and will have broken down into pieces too small to see, but causing widespread pollution. Plastic Free July started as an Australian project and has spread globally - last year 174 million people in more than 190 countries got involved in making small changes that made an overall big difference. www.plasticfreefoundation.net www.plasticfreejuly.org/get-involved

Will you take a thoughtful look around your home, school, workplace, the shelves in your local store and see just how much plastic is around? And then decide on a change you can make to cut plastic. For example...

- Say No to plastic brushes in the kitchen and bathroom
- Say No Thanks to plastic bags and packaging (really hard to avoid, but consumers have great influence.)
- Refill products in plastic bottles instead of buying new
- Learn to really dislike plastic
- Remember that plastic nappies were invented for travel, not for everyday use
- Think of alternatives to plastic freebies and giveaways, toys, lanyards, corporate gifts etc etc
- Aim to use natural products wood, metal, glass, wool, linen, cotton
- Congratulate your supermarket for the changes they have made and show your support for different ways of purchasing.
- Recycle where you can, but know it is better not to have it in the first place

Letter from the Rector

It's hard to believe that we're half way through 2025. As I write this letter we've had a week of clear blue skies, sunshine and high temperatures, but the beginning of June was cold and grey. Across the world we're seeing more and more examples of global warming or climate change. As Christians, we're called to care for the environment and here in mid-Suffolk we're doing our best to preserve not only our church buildings but also the green spaces that surround them.

All seven churches in our benefice are surrounded by churchyards which we have the privilege of continuing to care for. To that end it's important to be aware of the detrimental effects of climate change and to do all we can to protect those environments. We have introduced a number of initiatives across the benefice such as a dedicated wild flower area at Harleston to encourage pollinators to visit, and a designated wildlife area at Onehouse which we always leave unmanaged and includes wood piles and areas of bracken to encourage the natural world.

At Shelland bird boxes have been installed and the hedges aren't cut until the birds have finished nesting, we've also planted trees in the church yard. And Little Finborough has been awarded the A Rocha Bronze Eco Church Award because of the progress it has made in becoming more environmentally aware and is now working towards a Silver award. These are just a few of the initiatives we've introduced.

Throughout the year we also have a number of services that celebrate the countryside such as Plough Sunday in January when we celebrate the work of our farming communities and bless the plough, Rogation Sunday held in May when we ask for God's blessing on the crops and then of course Harvest Festivals in September when we give thanks for the safe gathering in of the harvest.

So, despite the continual changes to our climate, we will carry on maintaining our churchyards in the most environmentally friendly ways we can so that they are there for everyone to appreciate.

My son and I are both struggling to find work at the moment. He's just finished university and looking for his first job, and I'm retired but need to top up my income. We've both been sending out applications for a while now, could unpaid work help us find something?

Whether you're trying to get into work for the first time or after time off, finding a job can be really challenging.

It's always a good idea to think about what skills or experience you could be missing for the kind of work you want, especially when feeling stuck after weeks or months of sending out job applications.

If you can afford to take unpaid work, it can be a good way to plug gaps in your CV and get a taste for different types of jobs. These sorts of roles usually come in the form of volunteering, work experience, or internships.


If you receive welfare benefits, you should check the Citizens Advice website or speak to an adviser before taking unpaid work.

And because the rules around unpaid internships are complicated, you should get advice on being paid less than the minimum wage before applying to this type of role.

Volunteer roles are often well-defined and can expose you to specific types of work, whether you're looking for experience in an office or something more practical, like supporting people in your local community. Charities, including Citizens Advice, usually have a range of opportunities available.

Being a volunteer doesn't just give you a chance to learn and improve skills that are transferable to paid work, it can also help you gain confidence and self-esteem in a professional setting and provide structure to your day or week.

Great in Finborough Together (GiFT)

Great in Finborough Together is the village's good neighbour scheme, launched on 1st March 2025. It is co-ordinated by a small team of volunteers to serve anyone who lives in the parish of Great Finborough. Its' ambition is to be long lasting,

becoming an integral part of the healthy community culture the village already values and fosters – with every villager becoming a volunteer and every villager being aware they can ask for a gift. Currently there are over 35 volunteers and, to date, 11 households have received help - some of them quite intensively during periods of illness and/or major life events including bereavement and moving house.

We are developing a database of local trades and professionals that residents can access on request. It will only contain recommendations made by someone in the village who has actually used the service. Focus on Falls Prevention

GiFT is working with the Rural Coffee Caravan (next in the village on 18 June) and the local NHS team providing falls prevention support locally. Did you know our risk of falling increases as we get older. Falls can lead to a loss of confidence, injury and hospitalisation. They can be life-changing: the tipping point for needing paid care at home and a permanent loss of independence. Falls are not, however, inevitable.

If you've noticed you're starting to feel unsteady on your feet and it's stopping you doing the things you used to do – whether it's down to your health, your activity levels or your home environment – it's important to reach out and ask for help. Admitting that things have changed could help you stay independent for longer. You might think that moving less will help you avoid a fall, but actually, moving more and staying active is the best thing you can do to stay as mobile and independent as possible. Being active can help you maintain your strength, balance and coordination, which can help you prevent falls. This doesn't have to mean doing vigorous exercise.

As well as eating well, you should make sure you're drinking at least 6-8 glasses a day of water, tea, coffee or low sugar/sugar-free squash. When it's hot, drink a little more to make sure you stay hydrated and reduce your risk of a fall.

For those in their fifties, sixties and seventies: aim to go into older age as healthy as possible. Stronger bones don't just make a fall less likely, they reduce the risk of fractures if you do fall. Keep your bones strong by doing regular exercise such as walking, bowls or tennis. You also need calcium and vitamin D to maintain strong bones. For calcium include dairy products, fortified soya products or canned fish in your diet, and fortified breakfast cereals, pulses and nuts. For vitamin D, try to include oily fish, eggs or fortified spreads but it's difficult to get enough vitamin D from diet alone. Sunshine is actually the best source but, if you can't spend some time outdoors most days, have darker skin or cover it for cultural/health reasons, consider taking a daily vitamin D supplement.

Find out how you can reduce your risk of falling, and what prevention services are available. Sometimes simple changes at home can make a big difference. GiFT can help you and this guide provides more detailed advice:


