Welcome to the July & August Combined Newsletter:

I have been reading this newsletter since I was a small boy. I never dreamt that I would one day be writing this.

July approaches which means one thing for an arable farmer – combines. Please be patient as the trailers and machines start their busiest time.

My family have produced food in Combs Lane for four generations. My great grandad, William Herbert, rented Boyton Hall from squire Pettiward in 1906 and bought it during World War One. They have survived much on a journey of nearly 120 years – two World Wars, deaths, depression, marriage and divorce, grain mountains, milk lakes, the rise of the supermarkets, floods, freezes and droughts, trends and fads and the advance of technology and mechanisation. I can be justifiably proud of my history.

My late Dad, Trevor, spent 20 years on the Parish Council. I brought him to a meeting in 2019 on footpaths and ended up joining it. I served as Vice Chair last year. It's been quite an education. It is essential it continues. If the District takes over, it will cost all parishioners more and they will do less. Some of my work has ended nowhere in the past five years but much has not.

Paula, our Clerk, has stood down after over 12 years. I am personally very grateful to her for her guidance and I welcome her replacement. I am proud to be part of our community. We have a new playpark which Simon Tarabella spearheaded, a footpath map, new street lights which James was behind, white gates at each end of the village to make us conscious of our speed and a new large development opposite the village primary school has been refused twice. The annual Race of the Boggmen still goes on and we have a different flag flying weekly on the High Road. A memorial for a crashed bomber in WW2 has been built off Borough Lane.

The Chestnut Horse is my fave pub on the planet and it's still open. Please support it when you can. The church spire is a beacon of hope. Much of my family rests in the churchyard. The private school has kept Finborough Hall in tip-top order since the Electricity Board sold it.

We have a Golf Club, playgroup, wild flower meadow, football pitch, clubs, village school, various homes of all shapes and sizes and ages, herb garden, two car parks, a river and fields that feed the world and allotments. It's not called Great Finborough for nothing! Fishing lakes are under construction, maybe another irrigation lake and honey bees. I'm determined to fix the flooding of Sheila Peel's home in Valley Lane and keep Burford Bridge open. The current status quo cannot continue. We have barn owls and kestrels. They need enough wild food to survive.

The community idea of joining in with the National D Day commemoration was a magical time to remember the largest seaborne invasion in its 80th year on 6 June 2024. Peter and Dave cooked on the barbie and nearly £500 was raised for the Royal British Legion. Finborough School kindly donated the food and supplied the Portaloo. A massive to David and Bex from Dairy Farm for hosting. Graham played a wind-up gramophone of topical times. Bex created a photographic display along with Neil bringing along his father's memoribilia from D Day. Some gazebos, tables and chairs provided comfort and shelter. Four Apache helicopters flew over from Wattisham in formation. There was a huge bonfire and a chance to chat as a community. There were nearly 100 guests, from children running around to the retired.

A handful of people can make a huge difference. There is comfort and strength in joining together to make life for all better. We all have skills to offer. There is a mysterious sign cleaner afoot! Keeping the three vehicle speed solar speed indicator devices (SID) working correctly is a challenge and the parish monitors the defib on the green which could save a life.

Our job is to care for the community land we manage. You don't need to lead to make a difference.

My agenda is to start behind the garages at the weir in West End Road in Ipswich and dredge it backwards to Felsham. We will see. Change takes time. I have been trying to get the flooding fixed in Combs Lane for six years. I shall not give up. My battle with pot holes, drain clearing and speed limits is impossible.
