






Letter from the Rector

As we come into the fifth month of the year, let's pray that we will be blessed with warmer, sunnier weather as the countryside greens up and bursts into bloom. Driving around our benefice of seven parishes, I give thanks that we live and work in such a beautiful part of Suffolk and especially, in this the month of Rogationtide, offer gratitude for the farmers working on the land to help feed us all.

Rogation Day is celebrated on the fifth Sunday after Easter, this year falling on the 18th May, and may involve processions by churches and the blessing of fields and crops, as well as fasting and praying for a good harvest.

Living in a rural area, our prayers for a good harvest later in the year are very important. Climate changes are being experienced the world over, no less here in East Anglia, from hotter temperatures in spring and summer to much increased or reduced rainfall throughout the growing seasons. As much as those of us with gardens struggle with the fluctuating weather, it is infinitely worse for our farmers. As I write this letter in mid-April, we have just had some much-needed rain, the first for what seems to be many weeks which I certainly welcome for the plants in my garden and I imagine farmers are welcoming for their crops growing in dusty fields.

So, I finish with a prayer that is always offered in our churches on Rogation Sunday:

Almighty God, whose will it is that the earth and the sea should bear fruit in due season: bless the labours of those who work on land and sea, grant us a good harvest and the grace always to rejoice in your fatherly care; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

News from your County Councillor - Penny Otton

Suffolk Libraries: At Cabinet on 18 March, the council administration voted to bring Suffolk's libraries back in-house at the end of the current contract for the library on 31 May. Suffolk Libraries, who have held the contract since the service was divested in 2012, were the only bidder for the contract, but negotiations broke down and the council felt it had no alternative but to bring the libraries back under council control. The proposal to do this was passionately opposed not just by Suffolk Libraries, but also Suffolk residents and the many volunteers and Friends groups who work for and raise money for libraries in their communities.

Traffic on Combs Lane: I have agreed to pay for a speed/traffic check and to look at the state of the road and the number of HGV's using it. We wil also so the same for the B1115 Finborough Road, as this is where HGVs should be travelling!

Local Government Reorganization Proposals: Proposals from all Suffolk councils were submitted to the government by 21 March, Suffolk County Council has announced that it will be proposing one single unitary council for Suffolk. Subsequently, all the district and borough councils have now voted to propose multiple unitaries as their preferred option. All the councils now need to prepare a business case and submit it to the government by September. The government should announce by the end of the year what local government in Suffolk will look like in future. The plan is for a mayor for Norfolk and Suffolk to be elected in May 2026, and the government's public consultation on a new Mayoral Combined County Authority for Norfolk and Suffolk is open until 13 April if you are yet to share your views.
