

Cutlery



Everywhere I look I see adverts for upcoming sales - Black Friday and Cyber Monday 'deals' are jumping out at me from all directions. Some of the prices seem too good to be true - how can I be sure I really am getting a good deal and not being scammed?

You're not the only one eager to bag a bargain. The busiest shopping time of the year is also a busy time for cyber criminals who use the spike in spending to disguise their scams as legitimate shopping sites.

Fraudsters are also taking advantage of AI advances to help them produce accurate and professional-looking content to trick victims into giving away their financial details.

It sounds like you're aware there are risks when buying online and that scammers will try to tempt consumers with special offers, fake reviews and sought-after items at rock bottom prices. The good news is there are ways you can protect yourself and shop safely.

Here are five tips to make sure you don't end up with more, or less, than you bargained for during this busy shopping season.

- Make sure you don't feel rushed. Scammers will often create a sense of urgency by claiming it's a limited offer or price which encourages you to act without taking as much time to consider the purchase.
- Know who you are buying from if buying from a company you have not used before, check reviews and previous customers' feedback. If in doubt, don't buy.
- Be wary of suspicious web links. These may direct you to fake (but
- realisticlooking) websites. It is better to type in the website address
- yourself.
- Don't share any one-time codes that you're sent when shopping online. These codes are used to confirm that you're the one making the purchase, so don't share them with anyone.
- Avoid paying anyone you don't know by bank transfer. Paying by credit card for single items costing £100 and over gives you legal protection if the goods do not arrive, are faulty, or do not match the description.
- Paying by credit or with debit card for orders costing less than £100 also gives you protection using your card provider's voluntary 'Chargeback' scheme.

We are fully into Autumn weather now with some cold clear days amongst all the rain. Now is the time to finish tidying up the garden while thinking about plans for next year, whether that is small changes or a complete revamp.

Our October meeting was an interesting and timely talk from garden club member Mary Preece about Garden Design – Past and Present. She talked us through the development of gardens from ancient Greece, Persia and Egypt and how these influence our modern ideas of what a garden should look like. She also discussed English medieval gardens with their fruits, vegetables and medicinal herbs and the extravagance of Italian and French Renaissance gardens ending with recent designers such as Capability Brown and Beth Chatto.

Mary also talked about the principles of good design and how to create a garden that is both functional and aesthetically pleasing whatever size plot we have. She gave us some important practical tips to consider when making changes that would enable us to have a stylish garden that fitted our own needs.

Plans and photographs for Mary's own garden at South Lodge were available for us to view and so we could see how she had put the design principles into practice.

At our next meeting on November 14th Suffolk environmentalist Simon Hooton will be giving a talk about Swifts and what we can do to encourage them to thrive.

A reminder that subscriptions were due in September. They will remain at £15.00 per household and £2.50 for guests.



Village Maintenance Morning





Service at Borough Lane Memorial


In a now annual tradition, on 29 September 2024, the 1331 (Stowmarket) Squadron RAF Air Cadets held a memorial service at the Borough Lane memorial on the crash site of a Wellington Bomber from 99 Squadron RAF on 29 September 1941.



The story of the bomber had almost been lost to history and local myth before the Cadets had learned of the crash during a walk around local churches to research into local Commonwealth war graves. They raised money to establish the memorial and now maintain the stone and the bench that sits alongside it.

Astonishingly the story of the memorial stone being unveiled in 2022 reached all the way to New Zealand and the 102 year old widow of the bomber's pilot who got in touch to thank the Cadets for their efforts.

The Cadets were joined at the service by the landowner Mr Peter Bull, serving members of 99 Squadron from RAF Brize Norton, the Royal British Legion and villagers from Great Finborough, including Parish Councillors.
