
A reminder that on the 15th November we have our village maintenance morning. For this one we are focussing on the area around the football pitch.

Great Finborough & District Garden Club

Autumn is putting on a spectacular display at the moment which will soon change to fallen leaves everywhere and plenty of tidying up will be needed in our gardens. Let's hope the weather stays on the warmer side so we can get outside and get everything ready before winter approaches.

On Thursday 9 October we started our new programme of events with a talk from Neville Stein who presented Strange Vegetables: Gardening's Greatest Oddities - A Tour of Truly Strange Veg. Neville's talk was about far more than oddly shaped vegetables (although he did start with a few pictures to highlight that funny looking vegetables are fine to eat).

Neville gave us some insights into unusual items such as the fact that Japanese Knotweed is edible and can be made into humous or a Knotweed and Strawberry pie. There are many plants that grow wild like dandelions wild garlic and sea cabbage that can be eaten and there are some unusual vegetables that have been created by breeding. Brusselberg sprouts which are created by crossing red cabbage with Brussel sprouts to give a sweeter milder taste than standard sprouts as well as a vivid purple colour. Also Solanum which is known as the egg and chips plant as it consists of an aubergine grafted on a potato plant. Vegetable breeding aims to provide varieties that give an increased yield but can also withstand changes to growing conditions.

Neville's talk was very engaging, and several of our members admitted to having tasted some of the more exotic vegetables mentioned. Although there was a general consensus that the dried form of Cassava i.e. tapioca, brought back too many memories of school dinners!

On Sunday 12 October our car share trip to Porters Lodge Garden & tearoom took place. Porters Lodge is a working garden and tearoom on the outskirts of the village of Cavenham. The gardens were created by Craig Wyncoll & Lionel Stirgess when they moved to Porters Lodge 37 years ago. It features three acres of gardens with unique features, woodland walks, and of course delicious cakes. A wonderful outing was enjoyed by all who attended.





If you are thinking about Christmas shopping, please think "environment", the best gift you can give your loved ones is a thriving place to live. Refillable containers, and gifts made from reused and upcycled products are a great idea. Items made from natural materials; wood, glass, metal, pottery, cotton, linen, wool etc are also ultimately kind to the planet. Wrapping with fabric, ribbon or paper tape is also great. Gifts such as a tea shop visit, cinema, theatre ticket etc are something to look forward to in the new year, or how about buying something to encourage gardening and supporting wildlife? At such a busy time of year for some, it is very easy to slip into buying excess plastic and packaging, and things that will be discarded soon into the new year. Plastic is for its Life (100-1000 years) not just for Christmas!!

A real encouragement:

Over the Summer, the Design Museum in London ran an exhibition called "Human". All types of "life" (plants, creatures etc) rely on our planet to live, so their needs are equally as important as human needs, we are "More than Human". In considering what other life forms need to flourish we are enabling life for humans to continue. The exhibition showed the results of research grants looking at waterways, land use and fishing practices. There were traditional designs that have worked sustainably for many centuries, and items made from completely new materials, eg seaweed and fungi. Many displays showed new building materials and methods that provide homes for birds and insects, and installations that protect creatures from the worst of climate change. Nature can also teach us surprising lessons in living sustainably. Many artists, scientists, designers and radical thinkers are on the case, creating good adaptations to the things we need and the ways we work, so that the natural world is not just unharmed, but also supported. We can be a part of this too. If our mindset becomes not just "what do I want?" but " how can I live in a way that allows others to live?" the choices we make will be good ones for both humans and nature.

Village Biodiversity Plan

A village biodiversity plan is a local strategy to conserve and enhance biodiversity, often created by the parish council and community. These plans typically involve surveying local wildlife, identifying threats, and outlining actions for residents and other organisations to take e.g. the Parish Council. This can include managing green spaces sustainably, considering biodiversity in planning applications, and running local conservation projects. This is part of a wider framework that includes national and regional strategies aiming to reverse biodiversity loss.

To help create our plan in Great Finborough, we would welcome input from any residents currently doing similar activity, no matter how small, such as erecting bat and bird boxes, documenting birds in your gardens or even planting hedgerows and native trees, as well



as the ongoing development of our wildflower meadow and Wood pecker Hill wood

Understanding what goes on in our village will help us shape the plan which can then be utilised when looking at bigger green space projects, as well as suggestions for future planning applications. This has already been adopted at Pettiward Hall where we erected swift boxes to encourage nesting.

As well as the positive, we can review any negative elements that are identified, such as invasive weeds or trees growing where they shouldn't and any potential threats to local wildlife.
