



I've seen lots of stories in the news about people being left out of pocket if events they've booked tickets for have been cancelled at the last minute. How can I get a refund if this happens to me?

Keep an eye on the organiser's website and social media profiles for all the latest updates. You won't be entitled to a refund if you change your mind about going or realise you can't go anymore - but if an event is cancelled, your refund rights will depend on how you bought the ticket.

If you bought your ticket from an official seller and the organiser cancels, moves, or reschedules the event, you should get a refund. The official seller is the best point of contact to ask about how to get your money back. If you're having no luck getting a refund, check to see if the seller is a member of the Society of Ticket Agents and Retailers (STAR). If they are, you can use STAR's complaints procedure. STAR members should receive a refund at face value if the event is cancelled and the organiser has agreed to refunds.

You'll probably only get the face value of the ticket back - the amount printed on it. Some sellers might refund postage if, for example, the event is cancelled before the tickets are sent. If you had to pay any booking or card fees, you might not get those back. If the official seller isn't a member of STAR, check how you can solve an ongoing consumer problem with a business seller. You may also be able to get your money back another way, such as through your credit card company.

If you bought your ticket from a ticket-reselling website, refunds would depend on the site's terms and conditions.

If you bought from a private seller and the event is cancelled or rescheduled, then it is unlikely you will be able to recover your money. We still recommend you contact the seller.



#### **Help is Closer Than You Think**

If you've ever noticed an "unmarked" vehicle around the area with an "Ambulance" sign in the windscreen, you might have wondered what it was doing there. The good news is that Great Finborough now has a resident **Community First Responder (CFR)** living in the village, and that could make all the difference in a medical emergency.

CFRs are trained volunteers dispatched by the NHS East of England Ambulance Service to attend 999 calls in their local area. Because we live nearby and attend patients in our community, we can often reach a location within minutes, starting life-saving care while an ambulance is on its way. We're called to incidents such as cardiac arrests, breathing difficulties, strokes and serious injuries. We carry a defibrillator, oxygen, simple drugs, trauma kits, diagnostic equipment and other essential kit, and we're trained to provide immediate treatment that can extend the chain of survival until paramedics arrive.

Our village has always been covered by the Stowmarket CFR group, but now, with a Great Finborough resident on the team, help is closer than ever. Even when we're not officially "on duty", we still have an app on our personal phones which can alert us to the most urgent medical emergencies – such as cardiac arrests, within a 2km area– allowing us to reach a critical patient in the village within minutes, whether we're at home, in the Chestnut Horse, out walking the dog or asleep at 3 AM (this has happened a couple of times!)

What many people don't realise is that your local CFR Group is entirely self-funded. We receive no NHS funding for our equipment, uniforms or running costs, everything comes from donations. If you'd like to support the scheme, scan this QR code to donate.



Every contribution, no matter the size, helps us stay equipped and ready to respond.

All CFR's sign up for the same reason, because we care about our community and want to make sure that if you, your family, or your neighbours ever need urgent medical help, it arrives as quickly as possible.

#### **Local Government Reorganisation**

The 5 District Councils and the Borough of Ipswich have submitted to Government a proposal for 3 Unitary councils. This is now backed by much detailed work on structures and finances, ways of delivering services, approximate numbers of councillors and wards. You may have seen that the controlling group of the County Council has been attacking this proposal since Government announced it wanted Suffolk to work together to bring forward proposals to go unitary. They have been spending much public money to campaign against the emerging wishes of the 5 district and borough councils, which have collaborated to produce the plan for 3 councils. The headline objectives are to:

- Focus on and meet the differing needs of different towns and villages
- Ensure everyone has local councillors providing strong, local leadership and democratic representation – keeping decision-making close to you
- Ensure that the new Suffolk and Norfolk Mayor understands the big issues where you live

You can read more about our plan here: threecouncilsforsuffolk.org But important to remember that the decision will be made by a Government minister and announced early next year, and then developed locally and firmed up by a shadow council elected in 2027 and taking responsibility for all the services in 2028.

There will also be a single mayor for Suffolk and Norfolk, who will be elected in May next year.

#### **Dangers of lithium batteries**

Although these have been in widespread use for several decades, their potential fire risk grew over the last few years, along with the disposal of millions of single-use vapes. Below is a list of some products which probably include lithium batteries. Once in the waste stream, these go through processes which may involving crushing, and lithium under pressure can ignite, and then burns fiercely.

The BCC would therefore like to extend a special thank you to the exhibitors, judges, Buxhall WI, our volunteers, our composting exhibitor, everyone who donated prizes and all our visitors for helping to make the event a success. It was good to so many of our visitors stay to experience the full afternoon of viewing the exhibits, enjoying afternoon

tea and cake followed by the finale of the presentation of awards, auction and raffle draw.

We are delighted that the entry numbers and individual exhibits continue to increase year on year, facts we thought you'd like us to share with you.
