

Hall Committee

As you know the management of the hall is undertaken by a committee known as the Pettiward Hall Management Committee. Great Finborough Village Hall is a charity and the committee members are therefore known as "trustees". Our governing document requires us to have five trustees in place, one of which is nominated by the Parish Council for a term of office of four years; the remaining four are elected by the residents of the village at the AGM held in March each year and serve one year at a time.

The commitment is only approx. one hour per week for each of the roles, a little more when there is a committee meeting (six per year).

Villages need volunteers to run them and doing so makes us feel part of the community and this sense of community is surely why we want to live in a village rather than a large town. The hall is your village hall and it needs your help if it is to remain the valuable community asset it is today.

Food Security Fund

The new Food Security Fund has been established to support small scale, community led food initiatives such as community pantries, fridges and food pop-ups. Organisations can apply for funds between £250 and £5,000 to go toward the cost of equipment, food preparation, storage or volunteer administration.

Funding will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, with applications being accepted within the 2024/25 financial year. Successful applicants will be required to deliver their project within eight months of an offer being accepted, go to: www.baberghmidsuffolk.com and look for Food Security Fund.
